1 Corinthians 12:3b-13

³Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. 4Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. 8To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, 9to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

¹²For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Mid-Week Meditation

This week's mid-week meditation is coming to you through the e-echoes. It will be a scripture and some guided questions to help you reflect on that passage. I hope everyone finds time to engage with this!

Romans 12: 9-16b

- ⁹ Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good;
- ¹⁰ love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor.
- ¹¹ Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord.
- ¹² Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer.
- ¹³ Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.
- ¹⁴ Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them.
- ¹⁵ Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep.
- ¹⁶ Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are.

Questions:

- 1. Paul says to let love be genuine. What would you consider genuine love to look like?
- 2. How can we relate this type of love to God's love? God loved us even when we were strangers, by sending us Jesus. Do we love the strangers in our lives?
- 3. What do you think it means to love one another with mutual affection?
- 4. What about outdo one another in showing honor?
- 5. I could go on, but I would rather just turn you to look at each of the remaining verses, one by one, and think about what they mean to you. Look up what others have said about these verses, and see if what you came up with is the same or different as to what others came up with.
